GARBAGE COLLECTION REMINDERS

Council wishes to remind residents that bins must be out on the kerbside before 6.00am on collection day.

To avoid a missed service, we recommend placing bins out the night before. Make sure bins are placed at least 50cm apart and are clear of parked cars and trees by leaving a 1m space.

Please avoid parking vehicles in front of bin collection points on collection day. The collection vehicle can only lift up to 70kg.

DANGAR PARK UPGRADES CONTINUING





Work continues to progress on upgrades to Dangar Park in Narrabri, with security fencing works expected to get underway in May.

The tender for the Design and Construction of Grandstand Infrastructure at Dangar Park closes Thursday, 18 April 2024 at 2.00pm.

Upgrades to the area's netball courts are progressing well, with the contractor beginning works on the Wukawa Street side. Painting of the courts is anticipated to get underway in the middle of April, weather permitting.

The courts' upgrades have been made possible thanks to \$615,361 secured by Council through the NSW Government's Stronger Country Community Fund (Round 4).
